The generous employees of Greenleaf Bank donated funds to be distributed to a local charity for an



opportunity to wear jeans at work. Recently Mary's Missions was chosen as the recipient of these funds, together with matching funds from Greenleaf Bank. A check for \$740 was presented to and accepted by Mary Ehnerd from Greenleaf Bank representative, Michael Krutz. Thank you so much for your generosity and your great involvement in our community.

Project Updates:

Homeless: 72 Summer Snack Bags were delivered to NEWCAP, 24 each, during the months of June, July and August. These contained Tuna and Chicken Salad lunches, together with healthly snacks, hygiene items, sun screen, rain poncho, and water, as well as \$10 gift cards to McDonald's. They were distributed to area homeless by the Outreach Team. Extra Tuna and Chicken Salad snacks were also made available and donated by Walmart.

Our next project for the homeless will be our winter backpacks.

Veterans: In March, we received a request from the Milo C. Huempfner Health Care Center asking for earphones and a radio for a terminally ill veteran on hospice, who wanted to listen to music, but did not want to disturb others. We were able to fill that request.

We plan to help furnish a "little house" for veterans and are monitoring the progress of construction of these little houses by Veterans 1st NEW. At present, it seems there are still some zoning type issues to be resolved.

Native American Women & Children: In August, boxes of t-shirts, sweaters, adult booties and bedroom slippers was shipped. Some of these items were new, others, gently used. It is becoming doubtful if

shipments can continue, due to the very high cost. A good option, is going to our website, listed below, and using the Amazon or Walmart Wish List buttons to provide needed items for the shelter.

Culver's in De Pere hosted a fundraiser and our great volunteers did a fabulous job delivering meals, chatting up customers and collecting funds.
