Our pledge to Veterans 1st of NEW has been fulfilled in an event on June 19 – present for

Mary's Missions continues the Snack/Care Packs monthly, including for the summer, sun glasses, baseball caps, bandanas, and sun screen, along with 5 food items, 3 rain ponchos, socks, washcloths, pen, notebook, hygiene items and 2 bottles of water. 24 \$10 Mc Donald's gift cards, packed separately, are also included each month to be distributed by the Outreach Team.

A shipment of Pine Sol and Lysol cleaning solutions was recently sent to the Micah Center, a daytime resource center for adults experiencing homelessness or housing instability.

Shipments of diapers, bedding and bath towels have gone out to the Eagles Nest Native American shelter in Neopit, WI.



We were also blessed to be able to furnish a small refrigerator for another disabled, female veteran, who takes all her nourishment through a feeding tube. There was not always room in the family refrigerator for her weekly supply of pouches, so now she has a refrigerator just for her food supply.

Mary's Missions has been blessed with the support of Marie Wall, who, for many years, unselfishly shared her talents and skills, providing mittens, quilts, afghans and other beautifully made items to improve the quality of life for many, many people. THANK YOU, MARIE.
